The Greater Dover Historical Society submitted an application to Historic York, Inc., to be considered for recognition of the reconstruction and restoration of the blacksmith shop that was originally at the rear of the Neiman property on the corner of present day Queen Street and Butter Road in Dover Borough. Historic York, Inc., conducts an annual search throughout the local area for high quality preservation work through its Preservation Award Program. This year, one of the awards was presented to the Greater Dover Historical Society. The presentation was made at the Schultz House during the Historic York,, Inc., annual meeting. President Madelyn Shermeyer accepted the award on behalf of the Society. Gayle Heagy is to be commended and congratulated for her foresight in submitting the application on behalf of the Society. We are proud of the many volunteers who helped make this restoration project a source of pride for our community.
