With the beginning of another year, the Greater Dover Historical Society has some new projects planned or nearing completion. Some of these projects have been 'in the works' for quite some time.

One of the projects that has been completed is the survey of the homes in Dover Borough. As soon as the inventory of the homes are complete, a decision will be made as to which homes are selected to receive the brass historical plaques. A couple of factors in selecting the homes will be age and the integrity of the homes at the time of the survey. Integrity is defined as how closely the current homes have adhered to the original structure.

We hope to have three or four speakers address the Society in 2009. The first for this year will be Scott Mangus on March 19. Mr. Mangus is a scientist/executive with the Glatfelter Paper Co. in Spring Grove and is the holder of two (2) patents in relation to his professional career. He is the author of nine (9) books, maintains a web site/blog for the York Daily Record -www.yorkblog.com/cannonball and a number of personal web sites. He leads tours of York County Civil War sites.

Once again in 2009, the Blacksmith Shop will be open the 2nd Saturday, 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. April through October. Photos are posted with a sheet explaining the blacksmithing process. There will be a new brochure 'A Short History of Blacksmithing' available at the shop. This brochure will also show some of the tools used in the art of blacksmithing. There will be merchandise on display and for sale. The merchandise was made in the GDHS Blacksmith Shop.

Our Annual Historic Walk will be on June 16. You need not be a member to participate in this walk. The walk begins at the Blacksmith Shop in Ketterman Park on Butter Rd. and ends at this site with refreshments served.
